Well done boys. Next it will be the girls' turn.







The first half of Term 1 saw all of our students participate in a range of team building games and activities designed to strengthen relationships between classmates and develop their teamwork and cooperation skills through problem solving in groups. We built huts out of hula hoops and defended them from dodgeballs, raced to cross the court without touching the ground using limited equipment, and moved around the court in hula hoops as inchworms picking up items. Students showed great progression in their abilities to work in groups as they interacted with others in order to achieve common goals.

In week 7, our hākinkina focus shifted to Māori culture, starting with Year 4-8 students learning the traditional Māori game of tapu ae. The game has aspects similar to netball. Teams work together to shift the ball to their attacking end and knock tennis balls off cones to score points. Each class had an in-class session where they learnt the game terminology and rules before having the opportunity to get stuck in playing the game on the turf.

Our Year 0-3 students learnt about the Māori creation legend through storytelling with pictures and games based around the different atua and their responsibilities. The games required students to complete the same actions as some of the atua in the story. In one game, students became Papatūānuku the earth mother, Ranginui the sky father and Tāne Mahuta god of the forest, the son who separated his parents to allow light into the world.

Term 1 has provided our tamariki with some great physical activity opportunities and we're looking forward to an action-packed Term 2.
